



SOUTHWEST GRAZING LANDS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

(SWGLIP) PHASE II

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

The objective of SWGLIP Phase II is the overall health and vigor of grasslands, soil health, water quality and wildlife habitat by working with ranchers interested in increasing the overall sustainability of their operation.

This project aims to work with livestock producers to assist with the installation of grazing systems to promote rotational grazing that encompasses short periods of exposure followed by long periods of rest, aiding in the regeneration of those landscapes.

AVAILABLE PRACTICES

This project will be accomplished by assisting with the installation of grazing systems on private lands.

Grazing system development may include:

- Fence
- Pipelines
- Watering Facility (includes water source, pumps, and tanks)
- Grazing plans

Practices are cost shared at 60% of USDA NRCS practice costs.
